World Language
Spanish 1a

Spanish 1a is a continuation of language learning from 2nd through 6th grade focused on communicative language acquisition through listening, reading, speaking, and writing in the target language. Students will synthesize previously studied concepts to expand and reinforce real-world applications of language study as well as explore various cultural traditions. Throughout the course, students will engage in activities to study the community and members of the community, the geography and culture of the Spanish-speaking world and the enhanced opportunities for travel language study provides. These skills are taught via scaffolding curriculum that capitalizes on sharpening previously studied concepts while introducing new skills to expand current language capacities.

Getting to know you.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Utilize vocabulary related to introducing themselves and others. ● Engage in basic conversations that exchange basic personal information ● Use numbers from 0-100 to say the date, time and exchange phone numbers. ● Use the alphabet to say how words are spelled and to improve pronunciation. ● Use subject pronouns and distinguish between familiar and formal pronouns. ● Use the verb ser in the present tense.
What are you like?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Utilize vocabulary to describe themselves and others using adjectives along with age and birthday information. ● Use ser with adjectives and gender/number agreement. ● Utilize gustar to express what you and others like and dislike. ● Form the plural of nouns. ● Use definite articles. ● Students will develop the skills to read, write, listen and speak in Spanish
What do you like to do?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Utilize vocabulary related to activities you and others like to do. ● Ask and answer questions related to likes and dislikes. ● Ask and answer questions about what you and others want and like to do. ● Ask and answer questions about everyday activities and

School life	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Utilize vocabulary related to school subjects and quantity of supplies needed. ● Ask and answer questions about school schedules and classes. ● Use idioms to express physical conditions. ● Talk about plans current and future plans and give invitations. ● Form and utilize regular and irregular -er and -ir verbs to engage in conversations about school and after school activities. ● Students will develop the skills to read, write, listen and speak in Spanish
At home with the family.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Utilize vocabulary to describe people and family relationships. ● Form and utilize stem-changing verbs to engage in conversation about everyday activities. ● Utilize vocabulary related to where you and others live. ● Discuss chores and responsibilities around the home. ● Use estar with prepositions to say where items are located. ● Express activities using negation. ● Students will develop the skills to read, write, listen and speak in Spanish.
