

Curriculum at a Glance
World Language
Latin II and II Honors

This course will review, reinforce, and expand upon the language and cultural learning that took place during the first year course. Greater emphasis will be placed upon communicating more accurately and effectively in the four modalities - listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Students will significantly expand their knowledge and correct use of vocabulary, idiomatic expressions, grammatical structures, and English derivatives, and deepen their cultural understanding and appreciation. Continued study in mythology will reveal greater aspects of Roman life, customs, and values.

Prerequisite: Grade of C+ or better in Latin I, and teacher recommendation.

The Julio-Claudian Emperors: Students will recognize and express relative clauses, pluperfect tense verbs, and will investigate the lives and reigns of the 5 Julio-Claudian Emperors.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Pluperfect tense ● Relative clauses and relative pronouns ● Neuter nouns of 2nd and 3rd declension ● Julio-Claudian emperors (the first five emperors of Rome) ● Burial practices and funeral games ● Client kings of Rome
The City of Alexandria: Students will recognize and express nouns in the genitive case and will explore Alexandria, Egypt (the second largest city in the ancient world next to Rome).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Genitive case nouns expressing possession ● The layout and key features of the city of Alexandria ● 7 wonders of the ancient world ● Cleopatra and Rome ● The Great Library of Alexandria ● Multiculturalism in Alexandria as compared to today's world
Commerce in Alexandria: Students will recognize and express 4 th and 5 th declension nouns, neuter nouns, and will investigate the economic life of Alexandria.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 4th Declension nouns ● 5th Declension nouns ● Neuter nouns ● Glassmaking in Alexandria ● Economic life in Alexandria
The Worship of Isis: Students will recognize and express demonstrative pronouns/adjectives <i>hic</i> and <i>ille</i> , the vocative case with imperative verbs, and will explore the influence of the Goddess Isis throughout Egypt and the Roman world.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Demonstrative pronouns ● Vocative case nouns ● Imperative mood verbs/commands ● The worship of Isis and her influence in Egypt and beyond ● The Zodiac
Science and Medicine in Alexandria: Students will recognize and express the present participle, third person personal pronouns, and will explore the various practices and innovations in medicine and science in Alexandria.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Present participles ● 3rd person personal pronouns ● Medical practices in Alexandria and Rome ● Scientific advancements in astronomy, engineering, and mathematics achieved in Alexandria.
