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Dear Families,

This week Superintendent Robinson announced that students will be transitioning back to in-person learning with all mitigation protocols in place to ensure student and staff safety. On April 5th, students will return to school 5 days a week with Wednesdays being an early release day for students.

Attendance

- 1) Students attending in person are returning to 5 days per week.
 a. If your child does not attend school in person on any day, your child will be marked absent. You should follow the attendance protocol for reporting an absence.
- 2) Students who are currently in full-remote learning may remain in full remote unless you wish to have your child return to "in person" instruction.
 - a. You must notify your child's school principal if you wish to have your child attend in person.
 - b. Please see the attached expectations for remote learning that was provided earlier this year.

Opportunities for Support

The second semester of the school year is well underway. As students continue remote learning or transition back to in-person learning, the district will partner with families to support students.

- 1) Reach out to your child's teacher, counselor or principal if your child is struggling to engage in their studies. All schools have support staff ready to work with families to support all students.
- 2) If your child has fallen behind in assignments, please contact your child's teacher to find out how to resolve this issue. Use the Parent Portal or Google classroom to check in regularly for assignments that are due.
- 3) If your child has performed poorly on assessments, reach out to the school for an explanation of the content that your child does not understand.
- 4) If your child no longer has internet access or a working chromebook, it is important that the school be notified in order to assist in rectifying the situation.
- 5) **All schools will offer tutoring/support outside of school hours.** Most programs will be after school with transportation provided. Please look for further details from your child's school.
- 6) A summer school program is being planned and the details will be shared later this Spring.

This year has been challenging for all. Communication between the school district and families is important as we partner to support students in their social and academic needs. Regardless of their performance thus far, we are asking that you help us deliver the message that students still have opportunities to reconnect with their schools and teachers and make the most of the rest of this school year.
